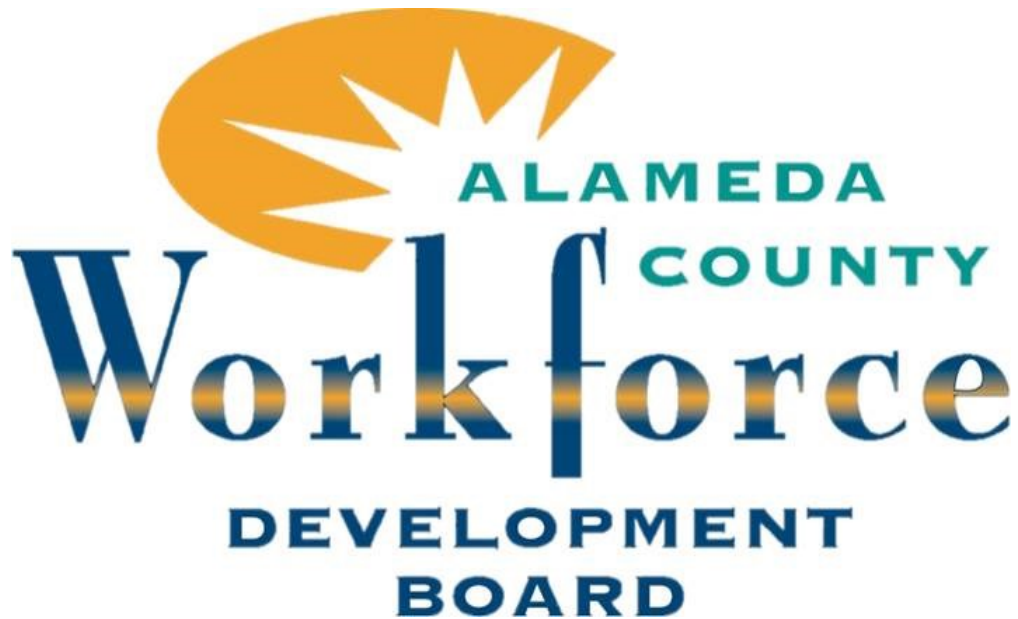

LEGISLATIVE UPDATES
FEDERAL AND STATE DEVELOPMENTS

FEDERAL DEVELOPMENTS:

Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (H.R.3684), signed into law on November 15, 2021, provides \$550 billion over the next five years to modernize America’s aging infrastructure (roads, bridges, transit, rail, ports, airports), address transportation repair backlogs, electric vehicle charging, and transportation safety programs, while bolstering America’s water and wastewater infrastructure.

President Biden’s Build Back Better agenda, which was decoupled from H.R. 3684, would make sweeping investments in America’s safety net programs and “human infrastructure”. The Build Back Better Plan has gone through several congressional negotiations and has taken a back seat to the federal spending bill, which is set to expire on February 18, 2022.

Climate Resilience Workforce Act

The Climate Resilience Workforce Act (CRWA) was introduced by Representative Pramila Jayapal in January 2022 to promote a skilled, equitable, and necessary workforce to achieve climate resilience in America. The CRWA also proposes to create equity-centered, and union-protected jobs for communities disproportionately affected the climate crisis, while creating an Office of Climate Resilience within the White House.

STATE DEVELOPMENTS:

California’s preliminary budget summary was released on January 10, 2022, providing an overview of the state’s forthcoming investments in budget year 2022-2023. California currently has a projected surplus of \$45.7 billion, which includes \$20.6 billion in General Fund (GF) for discretionary purposes, \$16.1 billion in additional Proposition 98 for K-14 education, and \$9 billion in reserve deposits and supplemental pension payments.

Several workforce-development items are referenced in the preliminary budget, however, the following proposed investments are fully or partially directed to departments within the Labor and Workforce Development Agency (LWDA):

- **Low Carbon Economy Workforce:** \$60M GF over three years to restart the California Workforce Development Board’s Low Carbon Economy Workforce grant program supporting workforce programs that align with the strategies in the state’s Climate Change Scoping Plan;

- **High Road Training Partnerships:** \$340M GF for training and career advancement programs for people with barriers to employment. Funding supports collaborations and training programs among community-based organizations, local workforce boards, labor unions, educational institutions, and employers to build partnerships and pathways into family-sustaining healthcare jobs;
- **Care Economy Workforce Development:** \$1.7B over three years in care economy workforce development—across both the Labor Agency and California Health and Human Services Agency—that will create more innovative and accessible opportunities to recruit, train, and hire and will advance an ethnically and culturally inclusive health and human services workforce, with improved diversity and higher wages;
- **Community Economic Resilience Fund:** \$450M GF to complement the Community Economic Resilience Fund over the course of three years to stabilize local governments as local economies adjust, \$215M GF over two years to support an oil and gas well capping initiative to improve the safety of communities while providing high-quality jobs; and \$50M GF to establish a fund for displaced oil and gas workers as the state continues to phase out oil production; and,
- **Healthcare Workforce Advancement Fund:** \$90M GF for the Employment Training Panel to support job entry and career advancement for entry-level and other workers in health and human service settings, with \$40M intended for social worker training.
