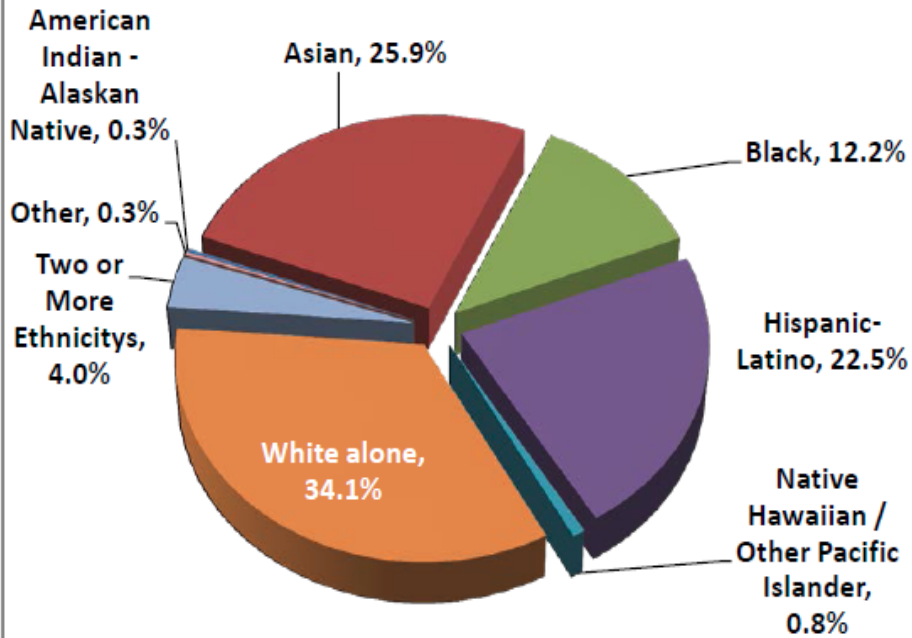


Emergency Medical Services Corps

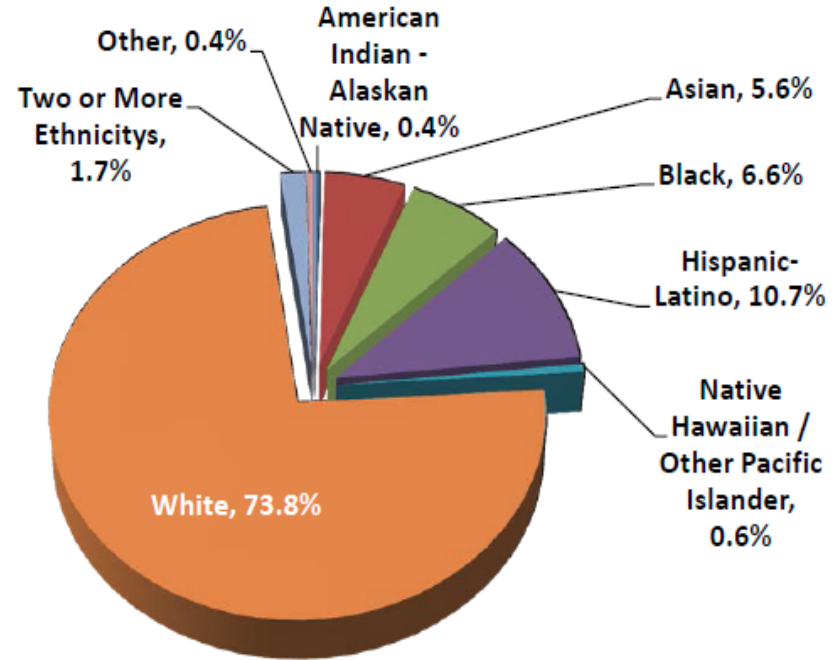
- EMS Corps is a program that transforms the lives of young adults and prepare them for a career in health and public safety.
- **Mission:** To increase the number of underrepresented Emergency Medical Technicians through leadership development, mentorship, and job training.



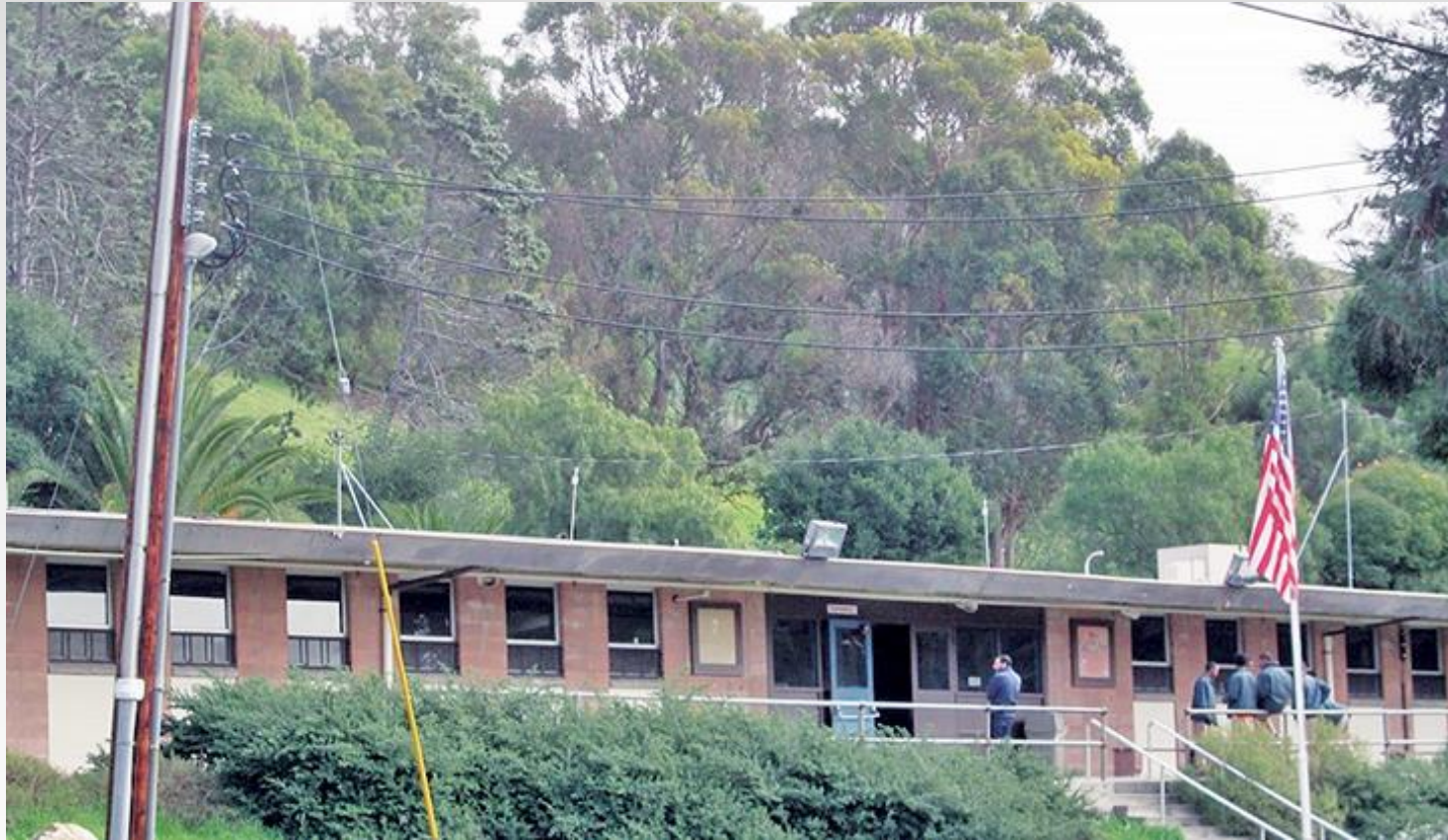
Alameda County Ethnicity % (2010)
